









In an adult, traumatic injury to the brain can result in diminished or loss of cognitive and or executive functions. In a young child, research has shown that damage to the brain may not result in the reduction or loss of functions they currently have, but rather a loss of the ability to develop the part of the brain that is injured... read more.
